Shred Day will be held on Saturday,

for personal documents ONLY; no
commercial papers will be accepted.
Please bring items that have a personal
ID number on them, such as canceled
checks, credit card statements,
paycheck stubs, insurance documents,
IRS forms, investment statements, and
the like. Papers that do not have identi-
fying information on them, such as
newspapers and photos, will not be
accepted. Documents must be brought
in paper bags or cardboard boxes that
can be recycled. Documents brought in
plastic bags will not be accepted.
