NO TUITION REFUNDS WILL BE MADE AFTER THE 2ND DAY OF A SEMESTER

REGISTRATION:

- Registration is done in advance prior to the Summer School semester to be attended in order to ensure enrollment in your choice of class. Course offerings are scheduled according to registration numbers turned in by May 8th. Late registrations do not guarantee a class opening.
- Students may pre-register with their School Counselor at their school beginning **February 18th** and ending **May 8th** for **1st Semester**.
- Registration in person will be possible in the Centennial High School office only, as follows:

<u>First Semester:</u>	May 27 -29 th	8:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.
<u>Second Semester:</u>	June 8 th – 24 th	8:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

NOTE: Tuition payment may be made in cash, check or money order payable to Centennial High School Summer School, Williamson County Schools

NOTE: Only registered students of Williamson County Schools (1st Priority) or high school children of Williamson County residents (Proof of residency must be shown) are eligible to attend WCS Summer School.

ELIGIBILITY:

The primary purpose of summer school is to provide an opportunity for students to either retake courses for credit that were previously failed or to audit courses for remedial purposes.

Exceptions are made for students intending to graduate early and/or who have been approval by the Director of Schools. To pursue early graduation, these juniors must have an overall grade point average of 2.0, a recommendation on school letterhead from the high school principal and include a current transcript. **This letter and transcript must be submitted to the Director of Schools for approval. Students should not assume that this approval is routine.**

Williamson County Schools will not accept summer school credits from any summer program within the State that is not accredited by the State Board of Education or from any summer school not accredited by a regional accreditation agency.

CREDIT:

From one-half credit (one semester) to two credits (both semesters and both a.m. and p.m. sessions) may be earned in academic high school courses at Williamson County Summer School.

ATTENDANCE:

A summer school student may miss a maximum of two days of class (excused or unexcused). If a student is absent 3 days, he/she will be removed from the summer school roster (**NO EXCEPTIONS, NO REFUND will be given**). Only **three (3) tardies** can be made up per subject per semester and must be made up before the next class meets. Early dismissals will count toward attendance. Time out of class for disciplinary reasons will also count toward attendance.

Early Dismissal

Students must have a note from parent/guardian with a phone number to confirm early dismissal.

TUITION:*

½ CREDIT (1 Semester)	\$250.00*
1 CREDIT (2 Semesters)	\$500.00*
1-½ CREDITS (2 Semesters)	\$750.00*
2 CREDITS (2 Semesters)	\$1000.00*

***NOTE:** includes non-refundable \$30 administration fee. Payment for tuition is expected at the time of registration.

TUITION REFUND:

No tuition refunds will be made after the 2nd day of a semester.

Refunds for tuition will be made only for extraordinary, documented circumstances. Refunds will not be made for students who "change their plans" for unacceptable reasons. Refund requests must be in writing.

EXAMS:

Final exams will be given on the last day of each semester, (AM Test Schedule is 7:30am-9:30am and PM Test Schedule is 10:00am – 12:00pm) June 26 for first semester, July 31 for second semester. NO final exams will be given early. A doctor's note is required to make up any missed exam.

DRIVER EDUCATION: Driver Education is not part of the High School Summer School program. Please contact your school for information.

- 1st semester (fall) courses in the regular school year are taken during 1st semester summer school (June 1-26). 2nd semester (spring) courses in the regular school year are taken during 2nd semester summer school (July 6- July 31).
- Courses may not be provided if enrollment is not sufficient.
- All courses require a TN licensed teacher.
- Discipline problems can/will result in suspension or expulsion from summer school with no refund. Students receiving discipline referrals may also be assigned detention.
- Board policy 6.310 "Dress Code" will be enforced.
