COMMUNITY

Page High School, located in Williamson County, is strongly committed to meeting the needs of its diverse student body. The school is located 20 miles south of Nashville and serves students from a variety of cultures that live in urban, suburban, and rural areas. Page High school has an enrollment of 896 students in grades 9-12. Page's spacious rural setting and progressive curriculum offer students an excellent high school experience.

SCHOOL

Page High School, which opened in 1975, is a 4-year high school in the Williamson County Public School System which is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. There are 896 students with 205 in the present senior class. The pupil/teacher ratio is 18/1. The school follows the semester system with ½ credit earned per course each semester. Students are enrolled in 6 credit classes. Class periods are 47 minutes long, with 8 periods per day which includes homeroom and study hall. 2 – 4 times each month, the school day is shortened to approximately 40 minute periods for each of the 8 periods. This allows time for staff development. The school year has 180 days.

CLASS OF 2008

The students in the Class of 2008 attended 62 different colleges and universities in 25 states. The class of 2008 had 173 graduating seniors, 94 Tennessee Honors Diplomas, 29 recipients of the Williamson County Honors Diploma and 8 recipients of a Page High Scholars Diploma. The class of 2008 was offered approximately \$2,100,000 in scholarships. Over 1.2 million was earned in the TN Lottery (HOPE) Scholarship.

GRADING SYSTEM

Numerical grades are given in all classes for each 9 weeks' grading period. Letter grades are recorded on transcripts. **Grades are weighted.** Effective 2005-06 for Advanced Placement (AP) courses, teachers add five (5) points to each 9 weeks numerical average. For Honors courses, teachers add three (3) points to each 9 weeks' numerical average. *Prior to the 2005-06 school year, AP courses earned 4 additional grade points, while Honors courses earned 2 grade points.*

Additional quality points are added to honors and AP grades to determine the GPA. The GPA determines class rank. Class rank includes all subjects given school credit beginning with the first semester of the 9th grade and ending with the second semester of the 12th grade.
