 - a. Evaluate a significant experience, achievement, risk you have taken, or ethical dilemma you have faced and its impact on you.
 - b. Describe a character in fiction, a historical figure, or a creative work (as in art, music, science, etc.) that has had an influence on you, and explain that influence.
 - c. Why do you wish to pursue the IB Diploma Programme at Franklin High School? What do you expect to gain from the experience?
2. Include a copy of your 1st Quarter report card. If this report card does not include your highest achieved math and foreign language classes, please detail that information as well. Please note that, while acceptances will be made while relying on 1st Quarter grade reports, acceptances are contingent upon a continuation of academic success throughout the entire school year.
3. Complete the student survey questions that are found on the following page.
4. One recommendation form (found as a separate page of this application) to be completed by a current core subject teacher, should be returned by the teacher to Franklin High School IB Coordinator's mailbox no later than December 1.
