TESTING FOR CREDIT

1 Students enrolled in grades 9 -12 who have completed a course equivalent to a high school level
2 course may earn high school credit toward graduation, except in U.S. History. Students may earn
3 credit toward graduation upon passing a comprehensive written examination in accordance with
4 standards determined as follows:
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- 6 a. The examination shall provide evidence that the students have mastered all of the
7 terminal objectives in the applicable curriculum framework adopted by the State
8 Board of Education and shall be scored and graded on the same scale as for high
9 school students who enroll in the course for which credit is being given.
- 10 b. Students must score 70 or better on the comprehensive written examination in order
11 to receive credit toward high school graduation.
- 12 c. The course name and a course grade of pass will be entered on the high school
13 transcript with the notation "Cr. Ex." for Credit by Exam beside the course.
- 14 d. Students eligible to test for credit may include students transferring from a district
15 which does not place high school courses taken at the middle school level on the
16 high school transcript or beginning 9th grade students with no high school transcript.
17 The WCS school must, however, receive an official grade report along with
18 documentation from the previous school that confirms that the student has
19 completed a high school level course at the middle school level before testing for
20 credit can occur.
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
