NEW RESIDENT STUDENTS

1 Principals shall carefully examine all applications for credit for work transferred from other schools,
2 both in-state and out-of-state schools, and shall allow such credit only when substantiated by
3 official transcripts provided that pupils transferring from schools which are not approved by the
4 Tennessee state Board of Education or by the comparable agencies shall be allowed credit only
5 when they have passed comprehensive written examinations approved, administered, and graded
6 by the Principal or his designated representative.
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9 In the case of the elementary school students, the examinations shall cover the individual subjects
10 appearing on the official transcripts, except that in subjects of more than one unit such as English
11 language arts, algebra, foreign language, etc., the examination need cover only the last unit
12 completed. If a student transfers from another high school with half units in courses for which a
13 minimum of one unit is allowed and if this student cannot, through no fault of his own, complete the
14 unit courses in the high school to which he transfers because of their not being offered or because
15 of scheduling difficulties, such half units may be counted toward graduation.
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18 If pupils are admitted to approved schools from unapproved schools by examination, it shall be the
19 duty of the Principal thus receiving them to keep the examination papers on file for a period of at
20 least one year.
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22 The Principal shall check pupils' records upon their entrance in the school and classify accordingly.
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24 The parent or legal guardian of each new student shall be required to provide proof to the
25 Superintendent of Schools that they reside within the Williamson County School District.
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
