SAFETY INSPECTIONS

1 All students, teachers, and others exposed to the risks incident to working with the materials,
2 equipment, and/or performing the acts described below shall wear eye protective devices of
3 industrial quality.
4

- 5 A. Vocational or industrial arts courses or laboratories using or concerned with:
6 1. Hot molten metals;
7 2. Milling, sawing, turning, shaping, cutting, grinding, or stamping of any solid materials;
8 3. Heat treatment, tempering, or kiln firing of any material or other materials;
9 4. Gas or electric arc welding;
10 5. Repair or servicing of any vehicle;
11 6. Caustic or explosive materials;

14 B. Chemical or combined chemical-physical laboratories using caustic or explosive chemicals or
15 hot liquids or solids.
16

17 Eye protective devices shall be considered of "industrial quality" when they meet the standards of
18 the American Standards Association Safety Code for Head, Eye, and Respiratory Protection
19 promulgated by the American Standards Association, Inc.

22 The principal or his designee is responsible for assuring that appropriate safety checks are made
23 in these areas with assistance to be available upon request from the central staff.
