TN Diploma with Honors: Students who have met ACT Readiness Benchmarks: English 18, Math 22, Reading 22, Science 23

TN Diploma with Distinction: Earn a nationally recognized industry certification, Participate in at least one of the Governor's Schools, Participate in one of the state's All State musical organizations, Be selected as a National Merit Finalist or Semi-Finalist, Attain a score of 31 or higher composite score on the ACT, Attain a score of 3 or higher on at least two Advanced Placement exams, Earn 12 or more semester hours of transcribed college credit

Volunteerism Recognition: According to state guidelines, students who volunteer 10 hours of community service each semester will receive this recognition. Must report volunteer hours on google form.

- **Individual Researched Essay & Presentation**— 35% of Final Score
- **End of Course AP Exam**— 45% of Final Score
